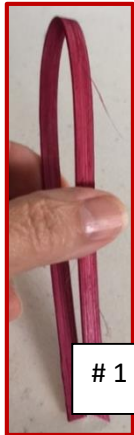


REED DAISY INSTRUCTIONS:

Materials: Use flat reed ¼" wide or narrower. (Use dyed, space-dyed, smoked, or natural – can always dye flowers after weaving.) Read through instructions before beginning.

For a 3-1/2" diameter flower, from ¼" Flat Reed, cut 4 pieces at 10" each. (For a larger flower increase length of reed pieces.) Wet pieces.

1. With the smooth/good side out, bend each piece in half, but do not crease.



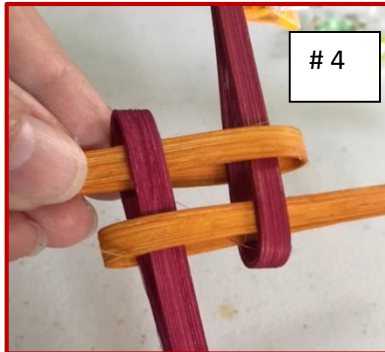
2. Take another piece, and place it around the first piece.



3. With the 3rd piece, add it so it is positioned opposite the first piece.



4. With the 4th piece, add it so it is woven opposite how the second piece is woven.

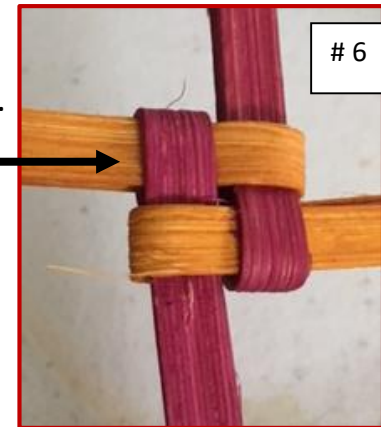


5. Pull and tighten the pieces (keep ends as even as possible; pulling one "leg" at a time may help with this) (Note you have "double legs").

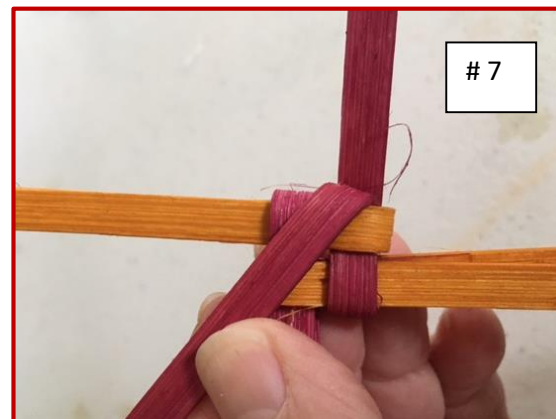


6. Position the flower as shown.

(Where the first piece is "over" then "under".)

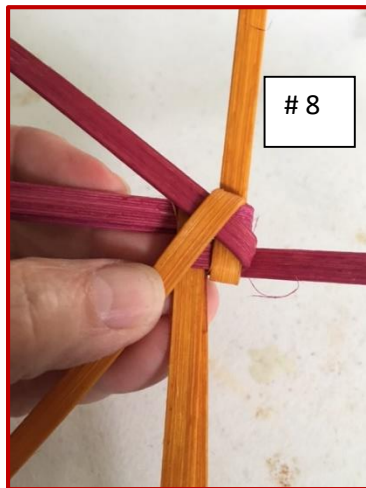


7. Think of the flower as a clock face. Take the piece pointing at 12:00 fold it down across so it's pointing at 7:00.



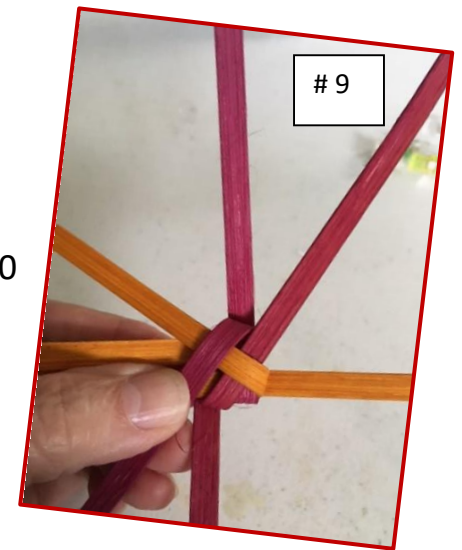
8. Turn the flower clockwise, 15 minutes.

Now take this “leg” and again take the piece pointing at 12:00 and fold down across so it’s pointing at 7:00.



9. Repeat: Turn the flower clockwise, 15 minutes.

Now take this “leg” and again take the piece pointing at 12:00 and fold down across so it’s pointing at 7:00.

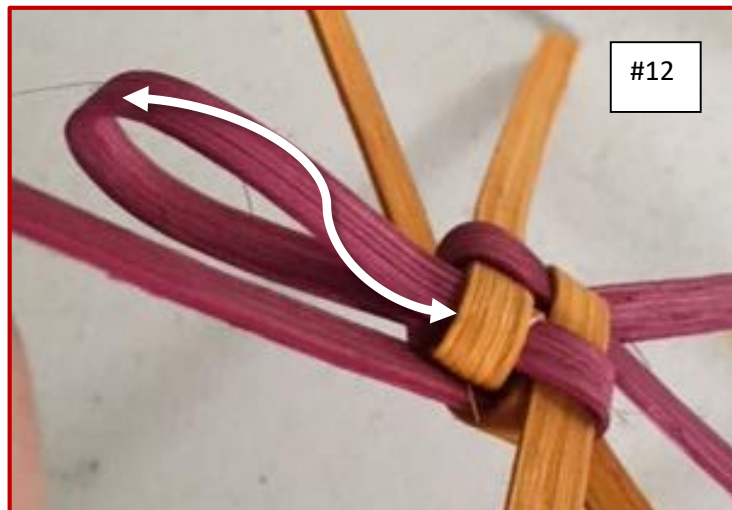


10. Turn once again, **but** slide the last “double leg” over the previous “leg” and then under the next (it may help to the slightly “back out” this leg to slide it under); tighten. (You’ll now have 8 single “legs”.)



11. Trim the legs to equal lengths (if using 10” pieces, each “leg” will be approximately 3-1/2” long.) (Can angle the cut to make the next step easier.) (Tip: Create a “measuring stick” out of scrap material.)

12. Take a “leg” and fold it over itself and insert it under the “leg” laying over top of it. (Do not crease.)



13. Continue inserting “legs” until you have formed all the petals. (Basically, you’ll be inserting 4 “legs” on one side; 4 on the other.)
